English

- Improving our choices of punctuation and using it accurately when we are writing.
- Using a wider range of sentence starters in our writing.
- Writing in a variety of styles: non-fiction reports about animals; revolting recipes; poster for QECP/Stubbington.

Maths

- Review different strategies and which one is the most efficient.
- Solving a wider range of word problems.
- Being able to reason why an answer is correct.
- Apply our number bond knowledge up to 20.
- Revisit money and making different amounts.

Science

- Identify plants and animals in their habitats.
- Understand the suitability of a habitat to the animals that live there.
- Explore simple food chains.

Computing

- Learning about the importance of e-safety.
- Being able to talk about how to keep safe whilst online.

R.E.

- Understanding the importance of The Easter Story to Christians.
- Exploring the theme of "Belief".

Music

- Improving skills when playing a tuned instrument (glockenspiels).
- Listening to and discussing music composed for The BFG book.
- Be able to compose a short tune.

Art

- Adding facial features to our Modroc puppet.
- Learning about Picasso and his use of colours.
- Using paint to colour mix our vibrant colours.

P.E.

- Understand how to perform a range of balances and jumps in Gymnastics.
- Learning how to create a short sequence of movements across the floor or apparatus.

PSHE

- Be able to recognise and talk about emotions in both real and fictional situations.
- Understand how their actions affect other people.

How you can support your child.

- Support them to complete some Topic Home Learning and practise weekly spellings.
- Continue to read with your child, little and often, making time to talk about the events/information, characters, vocabulary chosen, etc. Encourage them to answer questions by looking back at the text and explaining how they know.
- Practise counting in multiples of 2, 3, 5, 10 up to x12 for each number.
