



Our theme for this half term is:
'Time for change!'

English

- Retelling the story of Guy Fawkes through drama.
- Using the past tense correctly.
- Writing a letter in the role of Florence Nightingale.
- Identifying the four different sentence types (statement, command, question, exclamation) and beginning to use them when writing.

Maths

- Partitioning a number into different combinations of tens and ones.
- Recognise and name different coins/notes.
- Knowing that an amount can be made using a range of different coins and/or notes.
- Counting amounts of money.
- Multiplication and division.
- Quick recall of number facts.

Science

- Learning how some foods change e.g. popcorn and chocolate.
- Know that some changes are reversible and some are not.
- Investigating what happens when ice melts.

ICT

- Researching a topic using a search engine safely.
- Creating a PowerPoint presentation based on Florence Nightingale.
- Retrieving saved work and editing text.

R.E.

- Learn about the importance of Angels.
- Know the main events within the Nativity Story.

Music

- Exploring pitch and texture through tuned percussion instruments.
- Learning a variety of Christmas songs.

Art

- Colour mixing.
- Using mixed media to make silhouette pictures.

P.E.

- Develop basic Gymnastic shapes and inverted balances.
- Be able to change levels between floor and apparatus using basic skills.

History

- Understand why we celebrate 'Bonfire Night' and the role Guy Fawkes played.
- Find out about Florence Nightingale and the difference she made to nursing using different sources of information.
